It addresses key challenges on the route towards more sustainable raw materials management

- Secure supply and use
- Sustainable supply and use _

Sustainable raw materials management

It offers a *multi-stakeholder platform* on awareness, learning and dialogue for sustainable raw materials management



What is the content focus of COBALT?

Focus on raw materials

- non-energy, non-agricultural raw materials as defined by the EIP and high environmental & social impacts
- not included are fossil fuels (e.g. coal) and agricultural products (except for wood and natural rubber)
- 14 critical and scarce raw materials as defined by the European Commission (e.g. Cobalt, Platinum Group Metals)

Key aspects of the project

- value chain and life-cycle perspective (exploration, extraction, production and processing, manufacturing, final consumption and recycling)
- Industry and civil society dialogue



Two main policy strategies


- Europe 2020 (2010)
- Raw Materials Initiative (2008, 2011)

European Innovation Partnership on Raw Materials

- Established 2012 in the context of Europe 2020 and its Innovation Union Flagship Initiative
- Lead by DG Enterprise
 in collaboration with DG Environment and DG R&I
- Brings together a multitude of different stakeholders

4. Planetary boundaries


Respecting ecological boundaries with regard to raw materials demand

5. Systemic approach


Taking a life cycle perspective by considering both production and consumption systems




